## AN EXCEPTIONAL SCHOOL WITH A UNIQUE HISTORY



#### THE LEGACY OF LORD MOUNTBATTEN LIVES ON

Our Founder, Lord Louis Mountbatten was a distinguished military leader and Royal Naval officer. Our school houses, Daring, Illustrious, Kelly, Lion, and Wishart are named after ships on which he served. He was a second cousin to Queen Elizabeth II and was described by King Charles III as, 'the grandfather I never had'.

Our school opened in 1969. Lord Mountbatten gave permission for us be 'The Mountbatten School'. Our school badge, proudly worn by our students, was his personal cypher and today can still be seen on the entrance gates to Broadlands. Our very extensive grounds were once part of his estate.

On August 27th, 1979, at the age of 79, he was killed by a bomb on his fishing boat off the coast of County Sligo, Ireland. It was a violent end to a remarkable life. He was afforded a state funeral in Westminster Abbey but is buried in Romsey Abbey where our annual Founder's Service takes places every June.

Margaret Thatcher, the prime minister at the time of his death, said that, 'His life ran like a golden thread of inspiration and service through the history of our country.' In particular, she said, 'He was dedicated to building a better world for and through the young people of all nations.' This has been a guiding principle for our school. We want our children to be interesting and interested in the world around them. We have a strong international outlook and seek to bring the world into the classroom at every opportunity.

As the last Viceroy of India, Mountbatten worked closely with Gandhi to bring independence to India. He was the first British statesman to treat Gandhi and other Indian leaders as equals; he would banish any British staff with prejudicial attitudes from the Viceregal Palace. ## **ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE**

The Mountbatten School's long-standing reputation as one of the finest schools in Hampshire is no accident. We provide a learning environment where our students thrive and excel.

The vast proportion of our students in Years 7 to 9 follow a curriculum of English, mathematics, science, French or Spanish, history, geography, religious studies, technology, computing, art, music and drama.

A few students will follow a carefully tailored programme of literacy and/or numeracy support to ensure they are ready for the challenges of GCSE. All students have 100 minutes per week of high quality PE.







During Years 10 and 11 there is an impressive range of academic opportunities. All students must study English language, English literature, mathematics and science to GCSE. A large number will follow the three separate sciences of biology, chemistry and physics to GCSE.

As you would expect from a large school, we offer an exceptional range of GCSE option subjects.
