## **English Baccalaureate**

awarded to students achieving 9-4 Grades in:

- English Language or Literature
- Mathematics
- 2 Sciences (Separates or Combined Sciences)
- A Language (French or Spanish)
- and History or Geography



#### Be aware:

A number of Universities <u>do</u> have a requirement for some EBacc subjects at GCSE in order to be accepted on certain courses - check with the Universities themselves.

#### **GOOD REASONS**

- You're good at the subject
- You think you'll enjoy the course
- It fits your career ideas and plans
- It goes well with your other choices
- It is required for a future pathway you are considering
- You think you might want to continue studying it post-16
- Your research shows that it will interest you and motivate you

#### **BAD REASONS**

- Your friends have chosen it
- You think it will be easy
- Someone else thinks that it's a good idea
- You like the teacher you have now
- You didn't have time to research properly
