

The Mountbatten School Coronavirus (COVID-19) Catch-up Premium 2020-2021

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We will receive £80 per student Coronavirus (COVID-19) catch-up premium, a total of £113,920.

DFE Guidance on how this money should be allocated states:

"Schools should use this funding for specific activities to support their pupils to catch up for lost teaching over the previous months, in line with the curriculum expectations for the next academic year in actions for schools during the coronavirus outbreak."

How the grant will be spent

Our first focus will be students with the least time left with us – the gaps they have developed require the most urgent attention - this inevitably means Year 11. We will identify students most in need by comparing monitoring grades pre and post lockdown. Those students with the largest negative **differences** in attainment will be given priority.

National Tutoring Programme (NTP):

NTP provides one-to one tuition for students in response to Covid 19 school closures. The programme is being funded by the Department for Education and managed by the Education Endowment Foundation (EEF). TLC LIVE are the Tuition Partner responsible for the delivery of the tutoring sessions for our school.

We intend running two waves of NTP provision. The first wave for 42 Year 11 students who will receive 15 hours of tuition in English, Maths or Science during the school day (core PE time).

The second wave will run, if the first wave is successful, for further 42 students and will take place after school.

Half term and Easter revision programmes:

We will offer extra, targeted revision programmes during the Easter break. Students who have not been selected for NTP will be prioritised.

1 to 3 tutoring – selected students

Core: 3 tutors and 1 revision session leader – 36 students small group tutored EBacc: 2 tutors and 1 revision session leader – 24 students small group tutored Other: 1 tutor and 1 revision session leader – 12 students small group tutored

Larger group tutoring - available to all

 One teacher per subject delivers a more traditional two-hour revision session, interim work and follow-up (covering similar content) for non-selected students. A total of four hours over two days.

We will pay teachers to produce and deliver a programme for these sessions. 37 members of staff for two sessions.

Faculty grants:

We have invited faculty bids for funding for Catch-up initiatives. Each applicant provided a rationale for their bid — outlining how the proposal will support gap-filling for students. Many successful applications involve providing students with additional online support to be completed outside of classroom hours.

Planning time:

We will provide planning time to members of staff to re-draft schemes of work in light of missed learning. We will fund part time staff to complete work on non-working days, or to provide specialist cover for colleagues.

How the effect of this expenditure on the educational attainment of those pupils at the school will be assessed

The NTP and the EEF provide detailed feedback on students' progress and the effectiveness of the programme.

All other provision will be monitored by analysis of monitoring grades. Faculties will assess the extent to which stalled progress is improved. Line managers will analyse the data and identify successful, and less successful, initiatives.

We will regularly consult students to assess perceived success of our provision.
