Curriculum Updates and Extra-Curricular Opportunities

English

Students will complete their study of The Odyssey before moving on to study an introduction to

Shakespeare's Clowns and Villains where they will explore extracts from some of his most engaging

and famous plays.

Students continue to have weekly vocabulary words set via Quizlet which are tested each week.

Each week there is a 'Word of the Week' which is displayed around school on our screens and also within tutor sessions. You can find the word on our Social Media platforms. It would be lovely to spend

some time discussing the word with your children and trying to use it in your family conversations.

Scrabble Club runs in the Library on a Thursday lunch time to polish those word skills and get that elusive triple word score.

Creative Writing Club runs after school on a Thursday in the Library and is an opportunity to improve writing skills and take part in writing competitions.

Book Club runs in the Library on Friday lunch time.

Debate and Philosophy Club (Debosophy) runs after school in classroom J7. This is a joint venture between RE and English departments. We are working towards attending both the Philosothon and Debate competitions.

The Library

Library log-in: All students have been sent an email with details of how to log in to the school library remotely. Students can then browse the library catalogue, reserve books, see their borrowing history, write their own reviews and read book recommendations from other students.

Maths

Students will be placed into ability sets after half term following the recent baseline assessment.

The ability sets are not fixed and there may be some movement between classes as we review the sets on a regular basis. However, it is intended that the majority of students will remain in these sets for the remainder of the academic year.

Within these sets, students will cover the same units of work but the content covered will vary in depth and challenge according to the pace of the group.

The units covered are Unit 2: Analysing and displaying data, which they began before half term, Unit 3: Expressions, functions and formulae and Unit 4: Decimals and measures. There will be a short assessment following each unit of work, culminating in an end of term assessment, shortly before the Christmas break.

Weekly homework will continue to be set on Hegarty Maths. Each task set consists of a video with an accompanying quiz. It is recommended that students watch the whole video first before attempting the quiz as the content of the quiz matches the content of the video and is progressive in level of difficulty. Students have two attempts at each question within a given quiz with the option to seek help from the support video during the quiz. They can take the quiz as many times as they like in order to improve their score. If students score below 80% in their first attempt, the expectation is that they should watch the whole video and retake the quiz.

We recommend that students use <u>Hegarty Maths</u> as an ongoing means of supporting their classwork and homework alike, as well as in preparation for more formal exams.

Science

This half term students will be studying the first topics in chemistry and biology. More detail and

resources for students who miss lessons can be found here.

All Year 7 students will be assessed on their understanding of the initial units of the course on 23 or 24 November, the date depends on which class they are in and will be confirmed by the class

teacher. This will be a formal test sat in class, in exam conditions.

It is important that students prepare properly for this exam as it will be used along with the summer

exam to help decide sets for next year. Details about the content and revision tips can be found here.

Physical Education (PE)

Students will be placed into ability sets after half term following a rigorous 7 weeks of fitness testing

and game-based activities.

The ability sets are not fixed and there may be some movement between groups. However, the

majority of students will remain in those sets for the remainder of the academic year.

In the last two weeks prior to the Christmas holidays your child will have the opportunity to take part

in Interhouse Sport. Students will work within their house teams in a range of sports over the twoweek period. All points gained will work towards the Interhouse Cup, which will be presented to the

winning house at the end of the academic year.

We are now offering students the opportunity to sign up for paid extra-curricular clubs for next half

term. Those clubs are run by PBED members of staff. If you wish to sign your child up for Basketball

Music Lessons

The benefits of learning a musical instrument are well documented and include improved academic attainment, social mobility and a sense of wellbeing. For this reason, in an ideal world, Mountbatten School would like every child to be learning an instrument. It is not too late to request music tuition for your child!

The Music Department offers lessons on a wide variety of instruments and voice. We have some instruments which are available to hire.

The lessons cost £95 per term (£120 for individual piano lessons). Students eligible for Pupil Premium funding pay half this amount. If you have signed up for music lessons, they should be paid as per the details on your contract via your SCOPAY account.

Please note that if you wish your child to take instrumental lessons they will require an instrument to use at home. If you are struggling to get hold of an instrument, please contact the Music department to see if we are able to help.

Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE)

As you will be aware, all students follow the RSHE curriculum which was shared with parents/carers in the summer term. This term, each year group will be exploring their own content with a focus on discussion. Oracy is at the heart of these lessons. These lessons are focused on equipping our children

with the knowledge and understanding to lead happy and healthy adult lives.

This has been a big change for students and teachers and we would like to know students' opinion on

the work done so far - especially with regard to whether we are covering topics that are useful and of interest to them and whether they are delivered in a way that makes the subject accessible. We have written a survey which will shortly be put on tutor group 'Google Classrooms'. The results of the

survey will give us important feedback and shape the way that RSHE is delivered at our school. We

would really appreciate it if you could encourage your child to complete this survey before the deadline date of Friday 12 November.

Year 7 have been exploring the challenges of adolescence and considering what healthy, and conversely unhealthy, relationships with peers look like. This includes the topic of bullying, with a specific focus on cyber bullying given the amount of time young people now spend online.
