Curriculum Updates and Extra-Curricular Opportunities

English

As we edge closer to Christmas, students will continue to explore the classic ghost tale by Charles Dickens - A Christmas Carol; by the end of the unit students will have an excellent understanding of

the context in which the text was written and the messages Dickens' hoped to impart.

Students continue to have weekly vocabulary words set via Quizlet which are tested each week.

The first Dickens Museum and London tour trip went really well and we were really proud of the

behaviour and interest our students demonstrated.

Each week there is a 'Word of the Week' which is displayed around school on our screens and also within tutor sessions. You can find the word on our Social Media platforms. It would be lovely to spend some time discussing the word with your children and trying to use it in your family

conversations.

Scrabble Club runs in the Library on a Thursday at afternoon break to polish those word skills and get

that elusive triple word score.

Creative Writing Club runs after school on a Thursday in the Library and is an opportunity to improve

writing skills and take part in writing competitions.

Book Club runs in the Library on Friday lunch time.

Debate and Philosophy club (Debosophy) runs after school in J7. This is a joint venture between RE

and English. We are working towards attending both the Philosothon and Debate competitions.

The Library

Library log-in: All students have been sent an email with details of how to log in to the school library

remotely. Students can then browse the library catalogue, reserve books, see their borrowing history,

write their own reviews and read book recommendations from other students.

Maths

Following completion of Unit 1: Number in the first half term, students will complete work on Unit 2:

Area and Volume, before moving onto Unit 3: Statistics, graphs and charts and Unit 4: Expressions and

equations.

There will be a short assessment following each unit of work, culminating in an end of term

assessment, shortly before the Christmas break.

Weekly homework will continue to be set on Hegarty Maths. Each task set consists of a video with an accompanying quiz. It is recommended that students watch the whole video first before attempting

the quiz as the content of the quiz matches the content of the video and is progressive in level of difficulty. Students have two attempts at each question within a given quiz, with the option to seek

help from the support video during the quiz. They can take the quiz as many times as they like in order

to improve their score. If students score below 80% in their first attempt the expectation is that they should watch the whole video and retake the quiz.

We recommend that students use <u>Hegarty Maths</u> as an ongoing means of supporting their classwork

and homework alike, as well as in preparation for more formal exams.

Science

This half term students will be studying light and looking at chemical reactions and the periodic table. More detail and resources for students who miss lessons can be found here.

All Year 8 students will sit an exam on 19 of November. This will be sat in class, in exam conditions.

It is important that students prepare properly for this exam as it will be used along with the summer exam to help decide sets for next year. Details about the content and revision tips can be found <u>here</u>.

Physical Education (PE)

Students have now completed their first assessment within the sport they have been following over the last half term. Students will be moving onto a new sport for the duration of this half term.

In the last two weeks prior to the Christmas holidays, your child will have the opportunity to take part in Interhouse Sport. Students will work within their house teams in a range of sports over the two-week period. All points gained will work towards the Interhouse Cup, which will be presented to the winning house at the end of the academic year.

We are now offering students the opportunity to sign up for paid extra-curricular clubs for next half term. Those clubs are run by PBED members of staff. If you wish to sign your child up for Basketball then please follow the instructions below:

Step 4: Complete your details and pay.

The PE faculty would like to find out about any students that are competing at a high level of sport outside of school. The aim is for us to look at how we can support them in school and celebrate their achievements. Music

We are already working towards our Christmas performance commitments. Having had such a long period without rehearsals it is essential that students attend regularly in the lead up to these

Mountbatten Community Choir is open to all parents and friends of the school, the Mountbatten Community Choir meets from 7.00-8.30pm in the Main Hall every Thursday evening, during term time.

The Music Department offers lessons on a wide variety of instruments and voice. We have some

instruments which are available to hire.

The lessons cost £95 per term (£120 for individual piano lessons). Students eligible for Pupil Premium

funding pay half this amount. If you have signed up for music lessons, they should be paid as per the details on your contract via your SCOPAY account.

Please note that if you wish your child to take instrumental lessons they will require an instrument to use at home. If you are struggling to get hold of an instrument, please contact the Music department

to see if we are able to help.

There will be a number of theatre trips throughout the year, please monitor your email for details of these trips.



History

Year 8 have been learning about the African Kingdom of Benin and the trans-Atlantic slave trade.

This half term, they will be studying the industrial revolution and the British Empire.

Geography

Well done to our Year 8 students on their leadership, cooperation and problem-solving skills during our infiltration enquiry on the school site and the fieldwork to Tadburn Meadows. This term we will

continue to analyse our data as part of our studies on rivers.

GeoClub is running every Tuesday in classroom J9 during afternoon break. Do join us for

Religious Education (RE)

This term students have been studying Gandhi and asking 'what makes someone an inspiration?'. We

have enquired into his work on civil disobedience through non-violent methods.

For the second half term students will be enquiring into Gandhi's work in India to fight for

independence and his Hindu beliefs.

Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE)

As you will be aware, all students follow the RSHE curriculum which was shared with parents/carers in the summer term. This term, each year group will be exploring their own content with a focus on discussion. Oracy is at the heart of these lessons. These lessons are focused on equipping our children with the knowledge and understanding to lead happy and healthy adult lives.

This has been a big change for students and teachers and we would like to know students' opinion on the work done so far - especially with regard to whether we are covering topics that are useful and of interest to them and whether they are delivered in a way that makes the subject accessible. We have written a survey which will shortly be put on tutor group 'Google Classrooms'. The results of the survey will give us important feedback and shape the way that RSHE is delivered at our school. We would really appreciate it if you could encourage your child to complete this survey before the deadline date of Friday 12 November.

Year 8 are exploring healthy and unhealthy relationships with peers, including a focus on how new relationships are formed. This involves having key conversations about keeping safe in relationships, consent and the risks that are involved.
