# **Curriculum Updates and Extra-Curricular Opportunities**

# **English**

This half term, students will begin to study a wide range of poetry centred around the theme of 'identity'. Through a range of poets from the 20th and 21st century such as Maya Angelou and Carol Ann Duffy, students will explore how poetry can reflect and respond to how individuals exist within society. Students will also study autobiographical writing this half term.

Students continue to have weekly vocabulary words set via Quizlet which are tested each week.

Each week there is a 'Word of the Week' which is displayed around school on our screens and also within tutor sessions. You can find the word on our Social Media platforms. It would be lovely to spend some time discussing the word with your children and trying to use it in your family conversations.

Scrabble Club runs in the Library on a Thursday afternoon break to polish those word skills and get

that elusive triple word score.

Creative Writing Club runs after school on a Thursday in the Library and is an opportunity to improve

writing skills and take part in writing competitions.

Book Club runs in the Library during Friday afternoon break.

Debate and Philosophy Club (Debosophy) runs after school in J7. This is a joint venture between RE

and English. We are working towards attending both the Philosothon and Debate competitions.

The Library

Library log-in: All students have been sent an email with details of how to log in to the school library remotely. Students can then browse the library catalogue, reserve books, see their borrowing history,

write their own reviews and read book recommendations from other students.

Maths

Students will be working on a half term-long unit on Algebra. An assessment on the Number work

covered in the first half term will take place in the first week of the half term.

Weekly standardised written homework will continue to be set. It is vital that students follow the

clear instructions given on each task. The expectation is that students show a clear and complete written method that communicates their mathematics effectively when answering these questions.

This practice of "showing workings/calculations" not only helps teachers more easily identify

misconceptions (and therefore address them) but enables students to secure method marks in

national exams.

We recommend that students use <u>Hegarty Maths</u> as an ongoing means of supporting their classwork

and homework alike, as well as in preparation for more formal exams.

**Science** 

This half term students will be revisiting energy and looking at how formulas can be used to calculate

what is possible and how efficient processes are. More detail and resources for students who miss

lessons can be found here.

All Year 9 students will sit a science exam as part of a wider series of exams in the first 2 weeks of the

January term.

It is important that students prepare properly for this exam as it will be used along with the summer

exam to help decide sets for next year which will decide which GCSE courses students follow for science. Details about the content and revision tips can be found here.

## **Physical Education (PE)**

Students have now completed their first assessment within the sport they have been following over the last half term. Students will be moving onto a new sport for the duration of this half term.

In the last two weeks prior to the Christmas holidays, your child will have the opportunity to take part in Interhouse Sport. Students will work within their house teams in a range of sports over the two-week period. All points gained will work towards the Interhouse Cup, which will be presented to the winning house at the end of the academic year.

We are now offering students the opportunity to sign up for paid extra-curricular clubs for next half term. Those clubs are run by PBED members of staff. If you wish to sign your child up for Basketball then please follow the instructions below:

Step 4: Complete your details and pay.

The PE faculty would like to find out about any students that are competing at a high level of sport outside of school. The aim is for us to look at how we can support them in school and celebrate their achievements. If your child is competing at National or International level in <u>any</u> sport, we would be grateful if you could complete this quick <u>survey</u>.

#### Music

We are already working towards our Christmas performance commitments. Having had such a long period without rehearsals it is essential that students attend regularly in the lead up to these important events in the school calendar. We are keen to recruit more members to the following groups:

- **Junior Choir** rehearsals Tuesday during afternoon break in the Performance Studio. Open to all Year 7-8.
- Wind Band rehearsals Wednesday after school until 5pm. Open to woodwind brass and percussion players Grade 3 and above.

**Mountbatten Community Choir** is open to all parents and friends of the school. The Mountbatten Community Choir meets from 7-8.30pm in the Main Hall every Thursday evening during term time. No audition necessary. This is a great fun choir to join and no prior experience is required, costing just

**Music Lessons** 

The benefits of learning a musical instrument are well documented and include improved academic attainment, social mobility and a sense of wellbeing. For this reason, in an ideal world, Mountbatten School would like every child to be learning an instrument. It is not too late to request music tuition for your child!

The Music Department offers lessons on a wide variety of instruments and voice. We have some instruments which are available to hire.

The lessons cost £95 per term (£120 for individual piano lessons). Students eligible for Pupil Premium funding pay half this amount. If you have signed up for music lessons, they should be paid as per the details on your contract via your SCOPAY account.

Please note that if you wish your child to take instrumental lessons they will require an instrument to use at home. If you are struggling to get hold of an instrument, please contact the Music department to see if we are able to help.

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**History** 

Year 9 have been learning about the Second World War, the life of Winston Churchill and post-war

Britain. This half-term we will be studying The Cold War and the Vietnam War.

History Club runs every Friday during afternoon break in classroom K4.

Geography

Well done to our Year 9 students for their outstanding leadership, cooperation and curiosity during

the New Forest fieldwork. This term we will continue our studies of National Parks and eco-tourism

using the fieldwork data that we collected.

Students will also be studying eco-tourism and development in The Gambia, the host country to one

of partnership schools. There will be a fundraising opportunity coming up for our Year 9s to raise money for students in our partnership school to pay for school fees and resources to support Gambian

students in attending school. The Geography Department will keep you updated on when this will

take place.

GeoClub is running every Tuesday in classroom J9 during afternoon break. Do join us for

environmental improvement projects, discussions on current events, documentary viewings and

Geography competitions. GeoClub is open to Year 7, 8 and 9.

For students who would like to experience higher academic discussion and debate, *GeogSoc* is running

on Tuesdays in classroom J6. These sessions are aimed at developing oracy and critical thinking skills

through seminar-style sessions.

Religious Education (RE)

What a wonderful start Year 9 have had in RE! We have been enquiring into some of the arguments

for the existence of God. From the 'Design Argument' to 'Pascal's Wager', students have then

evaluated which of these arguments is the most convincing.

For the second half term the students will be questioning whether an all-loving God can exist if there

is suffering in the world? This is known as the problem of evil.

Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE)

As you will be aware, all students follow the RSHE curriculum which was shared with parents/carers

in the summer term. This term, each year group will be exploring their own content with a focus on

discussion. Oracy is at the heart of these lessons. These lessons are focused on equipping our children with the knowledge and understanding to lead happy and healthy adult lives.

This has been a big change for students and teachers and we would like to know students' opinion on the work done so far - especially with regard to whether we are covering topics that are useful and of interest to them and whether they are delivered in a way that makes the subject accessible. We have written a survey which will shortly be put on tutor group 'Google Classrooms'. The results of the survey will give us important feedback and shape the way that RSHE is delivered at our school. We would really appreciate it if you could encourage your child to complete this survey before the deadline date of Friday 12 November.

Year 9 are exploring what constitutes a healthy or unhealthy relationship with peers, including how 'groups' can affect our behaviour and the influence of peer pressure. This involves key conversations about risks, including carrying knives and the use of drugs and alcohol.

## **Leadership Skills Programme 2021-22**

This year we are offering up to 75 students in Year 9 and Year 10 the opportunity to take part in the Leadership Skills Programme. The programme has been designed to develop vital leadership skills via practical learning using English, Mathematics or Science sessions. It will include tutored sessions on Tuesdays after school and students will demonstrate their leadership skills by teaching a lesson to Year 7.

Successful completion of the programme will lead to the award of a Level 2 Certificate in Leadership and Team Working. This award is recognised by colleges when applications are made. In addition to the qualification, the programme is designed to improve students' confidence, motivation and attainment in core GCSE qualifications. The programme will also prepare students for prefecture.

The taught element of the course will be delivered in after school sessions on a Tuesday evening. These sessions will run from 3.15 until 4.20pm, with the first session taking place on **Tuesday 4 January 2022**.

To offset the cost of course materials and registration of the qualification, there is a cost of £15.00 per participant.
